- Ensure privacy and security



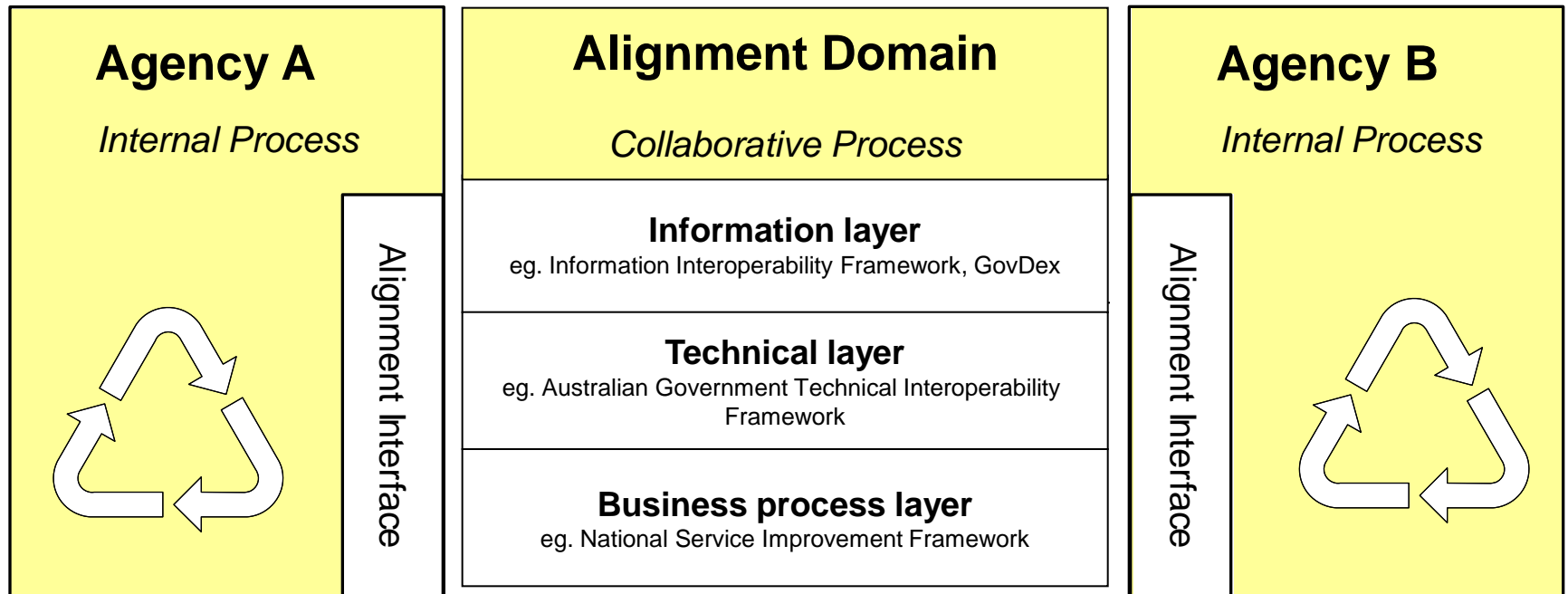
